here are so many colors to paint with, but sometimes, it feels like there still aren't enough," says Los Felizbased artist Alexander Yulish, who is able to expertly integrate an entire color wheel into a single work. Before moving to California 12 years ago, the N.Y. native spent his childhood learning techniques from his mother, fine-artist Barbara Pearlman. Maybe it's genetic: "If I didn't sell any paintings, I'd still have to paint," he says. "Some people are good with words. I'm not, so I paint to get it all out." The 37-year-old can complete a painting in 24 hours, or it can take weeks: "I'm finished when the conversation in the painting

is resolved for me." As for his favorite topics, Yulish's recent show at Gallery Brown in L.A., "Interior Stories," revealed a range of everyday scenes (Walking the Dog, Running Home, Eating a Banana in the Sun) in distorted, raw and energetic interpretations. A grotesque self-portrait with one oversized ear hung next to Standing Still, an ironic frenzy of color that could roll off the frame. With pieces already being snapped up by art world heavy hitters—the Annenbergs, for example— Yulish will continue his ascent as part of an upcoming group show at the James Gray Gallery at Santa Monica's Bergamot Station. alexanderyulishart.com.
